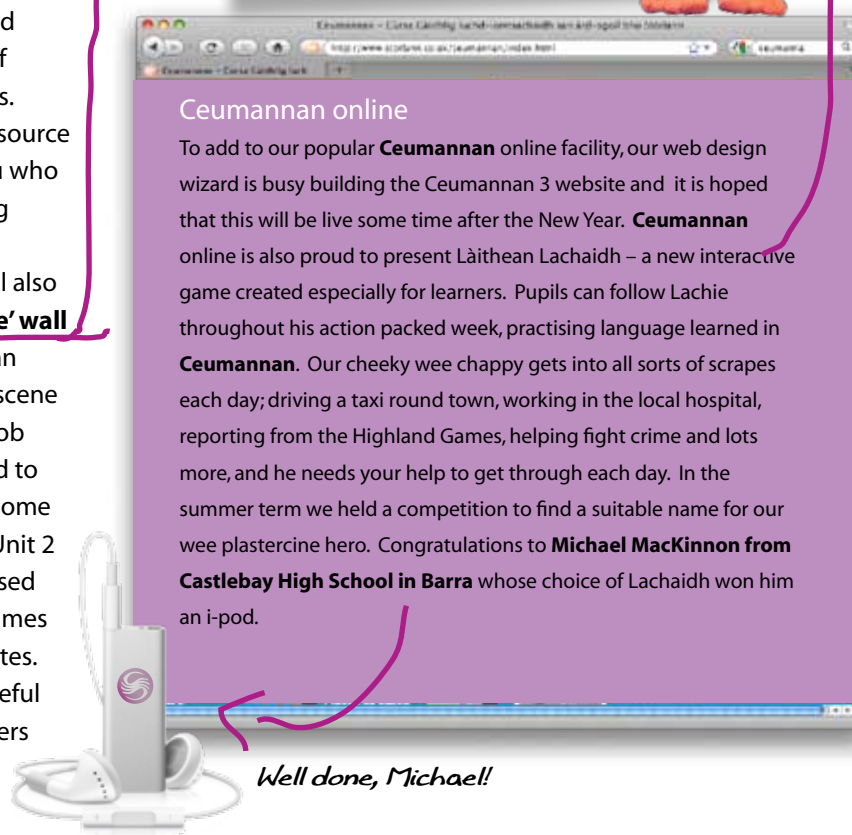

Santa and Rudolf have been very busy lately delivering **Ceumannan 3** – the latest book in the new series of textbooks for Gaelic learners – to schools in time for Christmas. The book had been designed to take learners up to and beyond the third level of Curriculum for Excellence.

Santa has some extra Ceumannan goodies in his sack for teachers this year! Along with the **Teacher's Notes for Ceumannan 3** we are issuing a **DVD Rom** packed full of handy Ceumannan resources from every one of the books so far! The DVD is easily copyable and includes all illustrations from the books – great for making your own worksheets, flashcards, game cards and suchlike. The DVD also includes all PDFs and sound files

of listening extracts, songs and dictionaries, as well as PDFs of online worksheets and comics. Hopefully you will find this resource useful, especially those of you who might have difficulties getting access to the material online. But that's not all folks! You will also receive a large **'Anns a' bhaile' wall poster** for each classroom – an attractive and detailed town scene by Ceumannan's illustrator Bob Dewar. The poster is designed to be used in conjunction with some of the exercises in Module 3 Unit 2 of the book but can also be used for various other language games suggested in the teacher's notes. We hope that this will be a useful resource for pupils and teachers alike.

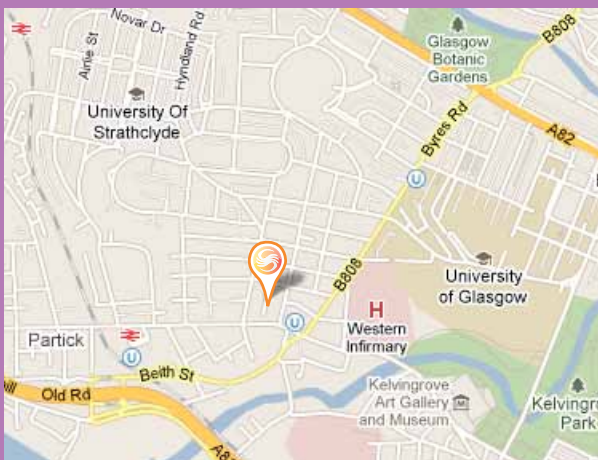

Over 100 delegates, incorporating nursery, primary, secondary and quality improvement officers attend the two day event.

Delegates heard two keynote addresses from **Chris McIlroy, HMIE** and also from **Angus MacLennan, Deputy Headteacher at the Nicolson Institute** as well as having the choice of attending a pool of workshops each of which was relevant to their teaching experience. An t-Alltan's main aim was for delegates to explore Stòrlann's resources and how they could be implemented actively in the classroom. The workshops were as follows:

Beairteas Cànan – Idioms and Phrases

A look at how to promote the use of idioms and phrases in Gaelic writing, and as a result encouraging children to produce better quality pieces of Gaelic writing.

DJ Smith, Glasgow Gaelic School (S)

Active learning activities that can be used in the classroom, to help support Teejay Maths textbook/ materials.

Spelling

Alice Macleod and Margaret Ane Macleod (P-S)

Active spelling activities to accompany 'Lorgan Litreachaidh' spelling programme.

Poetry

Catriona Lexy Campbell (N, P+S)

Drama activities that can be taught in the classroom to support 'Can gun Robh' and 'Smeòrach Mi'

poetry books. A look at how the activities can be linked across different curricular areas to promote interdisciplinary learning.

Big Writing

Anne Glennie (P)

An introduction to 'Big Writing' and how it can be used interactively in the classroom to promote writing.

Ceumannan

Interactive, give it a go approach to Ceumannan.

GLOW

Hands on approach to GLOW, highlighting its potential in Gaelic Education and in the classroom.

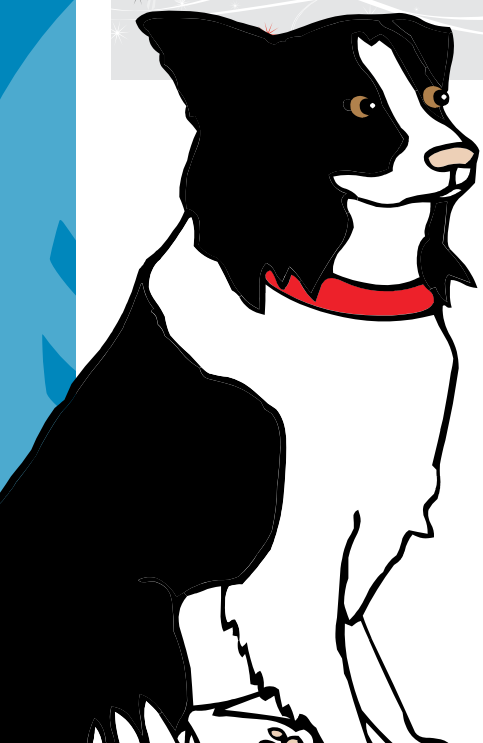

What is Modern studies?

Lately, a new unit entitled “Dè tha ann an Nuadh-eòlas?” was issued in digital format to **Modern Studies** teachers in secondary schools.

The unit was designed as an introductory pack for **Modern Studies**. Pupils in primary schools learn about History and Geography but they don't hear as much about Modern Studies. To develop liaison between primary and secondary schools, secondary teachers visit primary schools to tell P7 pupils about the subjects they will study in their secondary school. Stòrlann's advisory panel for Secondary **Modern Studies** recommends that **Modern Studies** teachers visit their associated primary schools and this unit was designed for that purpose. It is envisaged that secondary teachers could deliver one or two of the introductory lessons and then leave the rest of the unit for the P7 teacher to deliver. In instances where primary visits are not undertaken, the unit will provide an excellent starting point for S1 pupils.

There are two short Powerpoint presentations in the unit, one dealing with the concepts associated with **Modern Studies** and the other with needs and wants. The section entitled “What is Modern Studies?” comprises short exercises dealing with Crime and the Law, The United States, Conflict and Peace, Power and Control, and Needs and Wants. Each one of these gives the pupils an opportunity to work in groups, discussing issues and formulating opinions. A play, “The Court”, aims to teach pupils how to identify and evaluate relevant evidence. “Planaichean nan Leasan” is a teaching guide for teachers, suggesting ways in which the lessons could be delivered in class.

The unit was distributed in Word format and this will allow teachers to edit and change the content to their own satisfaction.

Storlann is indebted to Mary Ellen Stewart for designing and preparing this unit.

New Materials: An Fhìdeag

In

In October Stòrlann published An Fhìdeag Albannach, the first Gaelic textbook for music teachers. It is a Gaelic version of Fran Gray's Hands on Scottish Tin Whistle, first published by Taigh na Teud in 2005. This book was first recommended to Stòrlann by Sgoil Ghàidhlig Ghlaschu.

Fran Gray used numbers in grid notation to teach children to play tunes prior to them learning how to read music in standard musical notation. The grid notation and the standard notation are side by side on the pages in this book and, as a result, in very little time, children will learn not only to play simple tunes but also to read music. Each line is designed to be read and played as a phrase. Each tune is carefully chosen and they are all put in an order that ensures the course is progressive.

The book is now in schools and, soon, it will also be available on-line on Stòrlann's website. Then one will be able to listen to Shona Cormack reading the whole text, Dougie Beck playing the tunes and Rona Lightfoot giving canntaireachd versions of the tunes. Then, literacy in Gaelic and music should be no impediment to children learning to play the tin whistle! Another four tunes, not included in the book, will also be available on-line.

Fèisean nan Gàidheal assisted Stòrlann with this publication by ordering 500 copies of the book from Taigh na Teud. This reduced Stòrlann's per-item costs. Co-operating with Taigh na Teud proved to be a very pleasant experience. Christine Martin is an exceptional musician and she was exceptionally generous with her time, her guidance and her support. 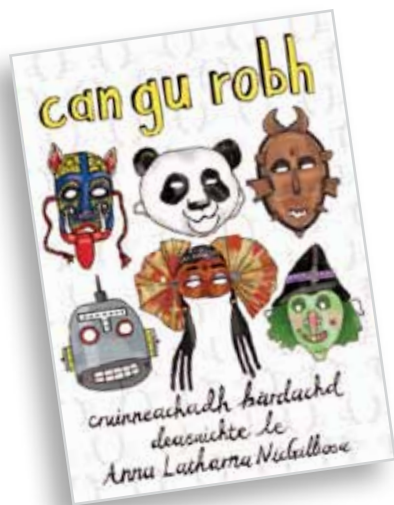
