**Cultar****Obair 1 Na Sithichean agus Sgeulachdan traidiseanta**

1. In days gone by, it was common for family and friends to gather in the evenings and entertain each other with songs and stories passed down through generations.
2. Stories about the supernatural, fairies, witches, wizards, seers, rituals, superstitions, ghosts, second sight.

**Cò iad?**

1. A race of little people who were in hiding underground because humans had invaded their lands. Also spirits of the dead or angels who were not allowed entry to heaven.

**Cò ris a tha iad coltach?**

1. Generally they look like humans but have magical powers – young, pretty female, or tall, radiant and angelic or short and ugly, like goblins. Could also take on different appearances to fool people.
2. Usually friendly to reasonable humans, sometimes mischievous. Humans have always been wary of them.
